



The European Defence Fund (EDF) supporting the complete capability development cycle








General objectives and budget

- Supports collaborative and cross-border projects in <u>research and development</u> on defence technologies and products
- Contributes to the competitiveness and innovation capacity of the EDTIB, including by encouraging participation of SMEs and other actors that are usually not active in the defence domain
- Contributes to reducing fragmentation of the Europe defence and industrial landscape
- Helps maximising the outcome of defence expenditure (*i.e.* spending more, better and together)
- Strengthens Europe's resilience and its strategic autonomy, notably by reducing EU technological dependencies on third countries




The European Defence Fund: general principles


- Demand is mainly driven by the Member States
- Need to be selective
- Complementarity and consistency with priorities commonly agreed by Member States and other EU defence initiatives and NATO
- Need to target projects that **bring real strategic and economic benefit for Europe**, are game changers for EU armed forces and would not materialise if not undertaken jointly
- Need to ensure **continuity** of already funded and completed actions
- Important for EDF to be inclusive and to offer fair opportunities for companies of all sizes from all Member States and associated countries
- Support to innovation: 4%-8% of the EDF budget must be dedicated to disruptive technologies
- Seek synergies with other EU programmes: avoid unnecessary duplications in funding and trigger cross-fertilisation
- No EDF support for actions that lead to defence capabilities prohibited by international law



Type of action, activities, funding rates



Activities, and baseline for funding of eligible costs, without bonuses:



Bonus (≤ 35%):

- PESCO

- (cross-border) participation of SMEs

- participation of Midcaps
- Indirect costs: 25% flat rate or actual costs (accounting)
 - European Commission #EUDefenceIndustry



Award criteria

- Excellence, potential of disruption
- Innovation: Novelty, no duplication
- Competitiveness: cost-efficiency/ effectiveness
- Industrial autonomy, Security and defence interests
- New cross-border cooperation (part. SME, mid-caps)
- Quality, efficiency of the action
- Member states jointly use/own/ maintain
- Life-cycle efficiency




National Focal Points for the EDF

Business coaching in the EDF for SME

- Successful SME beneficiaries may be offered Business Coaching (if successful in the open calls EDF-2021-OPEN-RDIS/R-SME/D-SME)
- Coaches guide SMEs in their business challenges
- Coaching offered for a period of two years





- Reduce the time from research to development, or from development to the market
- Boost growth of SME





Security Framework for EDF actions

<u>Protection and Handling of Classified information</u> related to the actions (i.e. Programme Security Instructions, PSI^(*) and annexes)



Under European Commission authority (in accordance with Commission Decision 444/2015)

Under authority of Member States in which the recipients are established (in accordance with National rules)

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- Established during the GAP
- Needs to be in place <u>before the</u> <u>signature</u> of the GA
- Integral part of the GA through the Annex 5 of the Grant Agreement (Security Aspects Letter, SAL)


